Definitions:



Bullet Camera: An overt camera that acts as a visual deterrent as well. Can be focused on a specific area or wide area.

These days, the functionality of these two cameras is largely the same; the difference comes down to your preference for aesthetic reasons.



Dome Camera: Camera enclosed on a dome. On certain cameras, it is not possible to see which direction the lens is facing.

Analogue or Digital CCTV: An analogue CCTV system is the traditional kind of CCTV system operated via coax cables, whereas digital cameras send signals which can be stored in a network and accessed remotely (e.g. via a phone app). It is possible to have hybrid systems incorporating both analogue and digital. See the table below for a comparison between the two options. Your WFP specialist will be able to tell you what's most suited to your needs as a result of your answers further down in this questionnaire.

NVR/DVR: NVR stands for 'Network Video Recorder', and is the device which encodes and processes the data captured by your CCTV cameras. Similarly, DVR stands for 'Digital Video Recorder'. Typically NVRs are used to connect to a digital/IP camera system, whilst DVRs are usually connected to analogue.

GDPR: Stands for 'General Data Protection Regulation', which is something you ought to be taking into account when installing a CCTV system (especially in a commercial environment) as this involves capturing imagery of individuals, which counts as personal data. Your WFP specialist can explain more about this and what you would need to consider based on the answers you provide in this questionnaire.

Questionnaire:

It is absolutely essential for us (and you) to understand why you want CCTV.

Establishing what you're looking to achieve by having CCTV will help us build the right specification for the desired system.

E.g. "I want a CCTV system to allow me to see the perimeter of my building, as I sometimes work alone here. I also want potential intruders to see the cameras and be deterred, which I can use to provide to the local police as evidence if they did break in, as there have been burglaries in my area recently."

From this, we can understand it is only external cameras which are desired. They should cover the entire perimeter (including ever entrance/exit point) of the building, and the video quality should be clear enough to identify individuals.

Night-vision cameras could be recommended if the customer does not wish to have automatic lighting installed so the cameras can film clearly during the night when someone approaches the building.


CCTV is best utilised for checking patterns of behaviour (for example with CCTV analytics), evidencing situations for claims, and acting as a deterrent.
